





In staging this year's version of "Skating Vanities," Russell Markert has rounded out one of the most brilliant careers ever seen in the entire show world. In his twenty years of experience, he has contributed admirably to every field of endeavor that comprises the all embracing term, "show business."

In the era that boasted of annual editions of the "Ziegfeld Follies," George White's Scandals, and Music Box

Revues, there appeared on the scene a sensational group of precision dancers known as "The American Rockets." Only a few weeks after their arrival from St. Louis, they were a featured attraction with Joe Cook's never to be forgotten musical comedy "Rain or Shine." This group of talented dancers displayed such perfect precision in their work that their mentor was the most sought after dance director in town. Of course it was but natural for Markert to organize and train the Roxyettes who were the Roxy's stellar attraction for years. When Mr. Rothafel moved his talents to Radio City Music Hall, his stage director went with him. The world famous Rockettes and the magnificent spectacles presented at the Radio City Music Hall all attest to the development of this young man to the point where he is acknowledged to be the peer of all stagecraftsmen.

The first big musical motion picture, "The King of Jazz" built around Paul Whiteman, brought Markert to Hollywood where he immediately scored the same success that marked his stage efforts. In 1940, he sought further fields to conquer, and scored sensationally with the first big super ice show "Ice-Capades."





